Is Your Pet A Senior?

If your pet is age 7 or older, s/he is now considered a senior! We recognize how important your senior pet family members are to you and would like to keep them happy and healthy as long as possible. Statistically, 1 out of 5 dogs and 1 out of 4 cats has an underlying condition that cannot be diagnosed with a physical exam alone. The gradual onset of disease in seemingly healthy pets will often go unnoticed. Many times, the symptoms you may perceive as normal aging are actually signs that something may be wrong. Once symptoms do appear, the condition may be difficult and costly to treat and diagnose. This is why an Early Detection Program is so vital to your pet's quality of life. This program includes a comprehensive physical exam, laboratory tests your veterinarian can use to diagnose blood disorders, kidney and liver disease, diabetes, infection, thyroid disease and other hormonal problems. Many of these conditions can be prevented, controlled or reversed if diagnosed early.
